Title of Resolution:

No to NHS Fake Penises

Wording of the Resolution:

This meeting calls for the NHS to stop conducting medically unnecessary surgeries to create a fake penis on women who believe that they are men.

The Issue:

The NHS is funding surgeries that remove a section of a woman's forearm or thigh to create a roll of flesh that is subsequently sewn into her groin, after the removal of her vagina and uterus, to create a pseudo penis. This three part procedure has multiple risks, including necrosis and the piece of skin rotting and dying. There is very little evidence that this procedure, like all "gender affirming" treatments, alleviates gender dysphoria.

Objective:

To stop women from undergoing these extreme surgeries that often have deleterious outcomes for them, resulting in multiple revisions and complications.

Potential:

Each surgery can cost between £20,000 to £70,000, Chelsea and Westminster Hospital have a specific clinic for this, there are long waiting lists. There is potential to save the NHS a lot of money on this.

Work with organisations who help women come to terms with their sexed bodies and highlight the dangers of this surgery.

Work with de-transitioners such as Scott Newgent.
