Title of Resolution:

No to NHS Castrations

Wording of the Resolution:

This meeting calls for the NHS to stop conducting medically unnecessary castrations on men who believe they are women, and for these men to be given counselling for them to accept their male body.

The Issue:

Currently men who believe they are women are offered castration and penile inversion surgery to create a canal in the body which is supposed to mimic a vagina. In reality this opening needs constant attention to ensure it does not close and cause infection, which can lead to death.

There many risks associated with this surgery, including:

- Bleeding
- Infection
- Tissue necrosis (tissue dying)
- Narrowing of the canal
- Fistula
- Rectal injury
- Granulation
- Prolapse
- Problems urinating

This surgery is irreversible and will cause the patient to be on lifelong hormone treatment as the orchidectomy (removal of testes) prevents the body from producing testosterone.

There is no evidence that this extreme body modification surgery alleviates feelings of gender dysphoria and if a man desists in feeling he is the opposite sex

The care of these men when they are elderly may involve dilation of this canal, which may have to be carried out by a care worker.

Objective:

To ensure that men who wish to have this surgery understand it has life long consequences, to ensure medical professionals return to "first do no harm".

Potential:

Work with professionals such as Dr Az Hakeem, detransitioners who have been harmed by these surgeries. Ensure the Cass Review is fully implemented.
